VET CHECKS EXPERT GROUP

- Re-enforced checks (REC)
 - Brazilian meat and meat products: Directorate F carried out three missions – await report. Till then carry on with re-enforced checks – 100% physical check and sampling 20% for microbiology. To concentrate on raw meat
 - Ensure that all results are entered in TRACES when known. Remember to update both box 29 of the CVED and the sample result section
 - Complete RASFF when public or animal health risk

Vet checks Expert Group

- Labelling for allergens such as albumin
- No lab tests required, only a check on the label. If albumins listed on label
- then confirm that label check has been satisfactory

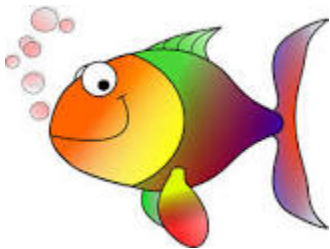

VET CHECKS EXPERT GROUP

- Exemption from REC: Ensure CVED is in progress.
Send message to Help desk explaining clearly why the consignment should be exempted
- Do not carry out other tests on consignment that are subject to REC – TRACES cannot cope



Vet Checks Expert Group

- Fishery products from India and Vietnam Establishments that fail residue plans – immediate delisting by Commission
- Imposed checks on consignments on the water
- Any problems?
- Transhipments of fishery products to freezer vessels – freezer vessels must be listed. IUU documents often show vessels not approved
- New format CVEDs almost ready for a vote
- New Official Control Regulations 2017/625 now published
- New Regulations and detailed legislation will be discussed in various groups over next 3 years

INTRODUCTION

- Decision 2016/1196 amended Decision 2007/275 in July 2016 with application date of 1 January 2017
- Several major changes including removing products from Annex II which are now subject to veterinary checks
- Instructions to BIPs in OVS notes: 2016/20 and 2016/33

CHANGES

- Several references to composite rules added into Decision such as in 1604
- 0508 : Cuttlefish with flesh on subject to checks, if no flesh, then not subject to checks and will require an authorisation as no harmonised rules
- 0602 90 10: Mushroom spawn containing processed manure of animal origin. See Row 1 of Table 2 in Chapter II of Annex XIV of Regulation 142/2011 (Chapter 17 health certificate –processed manure)
- 1505 : All wool grease with special reference to rendered fats and intermediate products (relevant import conditions will apply – see Import information notes)
- 1518 : animal fat (NHC), vegetable oil containing animal products and used cooking oil (UCO) – see OVS note 2016/32 for UCO – not subject to checks currently)
- 1603: clarifying that meat extracts, meat concentrates, shark cartilage also covered by this CN code (Meat extracts and concentrates will require meat product certificate or composite health certificate. Shark cartilage and fish protein in gel form – fishery products?)

CHANGES 2

- 1702: Lactose and mixtures of lactose added to description. Dairy products or composite import conditions will apply
- 1806: chocolate and food containing cocoa: Composite rules and Annex II will apply – must have more than 50% dairy to be subject to veterinary checks.
- 1901: now clarify that only products containing POAO may be subject to checks as some will be composites.
- (Only products containing less than 20% POAO covered by CN code 19)
- 1904 10 10 added (food containing maize) – contains less than 20% POAO and may be subject to checks depending on whether composite or not
- 1905 patisseries – include waffles, wafers, quiche and pizza – may or may not be subject to checks depending on content and composition. Pizza containing meat may be subject to checks, pizza containing melted cheese may not be
- 2104 soups and broths etc. Will be subject to checks if containing POAO- composite rules apply. Includes infant food in small containers

Changes 3

- 2106 90 92, 2106 90 98 – covers wide range of products – relevant import conditions apply
- 2202 range of drinks containing POAO – composite or pure POAO import conditions apply e.g. yoghurt drink with cereals, coffee drinks
- 2208 : Liqueurs and cordials – those containing POAO e.g. dairy or egg – relevant import conditions will apply. Could be dairy or egg products if not composites. Do we check any?
- 2309: preparations for animal feeding – all if containing POAO.
- 2922 49 other amino acids – typo in Column 3? Should say if raw material of animal origin used for food supplements or for animal feed.
- 2925 29 00 : creatine of animal origin – will require Authorisation, but not currently
- 2930 : cysteine, cystine and derivatives of these – require highly refined products import conditions. (Health certificate in Regulation 2016/759) Information on Leucine to follow
- 2932 9900 – if of animal origin such as glucosamine
- 2942 00 00 – Other organic compounds Only if of animal origin.’ will need examples of these to know what the import conditions will be

CHANGES 3

- 3001 90 91 heparin and salts: POAO to be further processed for uses set out in Article 33 (medical devices etc.)
- 3002 10 98 replace 3002 10 99 – blood fractions and other immunological products – if POAO then relevant import conditions will apply (could be intermediate, blood products or other)
- 3101 00 00 fertilisers – only change is clarification that mineralised guano excluded from checks
- 3105 10 00 fertiliser in packages less than 10kg – import conditions of manure or the relevant POAO will apply (some contain processed animal protein)
- 3204 colouring matters – if in milk fat base then subject to checks – if not composite product, or dairy product then authorisation may be required
- 3302 odiferous substances – flavourings in milk fat base for food or feed product. If not composite product, or dairy product then authorisation may be required
- 3505 gelatin – gelatin and unfilled gelatin capsules for food or animal feed use. See information later

Changes 4

- 3507 90 90 enzymes containing POAO – will require an authorisation or may be dairy products
- 3822 00 00: amended to make clear that medical devices and in vitro diagnostic devices are excluded if covered by relevant legislation
- 3825 10 00: amended- covers catering waste containing animal products intended for animal feed, biogas, rendering or novel processing methods (Article 2(2) of Regulation 1069/2009). Will require an Authorisation
- 3913 90 00 amended to also include hardened gelatin – gelatin import conditions apply
- 3926 90 92 and 90 97 added – empty gelatin capsules for animal consumption also state import conditions. (Chapter 11 certificate)
- 7101 2100 added: Oysters containing pearls and unworked cultured pearls. Unworked cultured pearls only covered if containing flesh as those not containing flesh excluded by Article 2(2) (f) of Regulation 1069/2009. General Authorisation [IMP/GEN/16/02](#) issued

CHANGES 5

- 9602 00 00 added – empty gelatin capsules for HC and NHC. See OVS note 2016/33. National rules apply for HC - General Authorisations published on [GOV.UK](http://gov.uk)
- Empty gelatin capsules: if containing gelatin from bovine, ovine and caprine material, a Certificate of suitability (CEP) required. Details of how to obtain such a certificate on [EDQM website](http://edqm.eu)

Changes 6

- Gelatin capsules NHC – health certificate for gelatin in Regulation 142/2011 required
- 99 30 24 00 and 9930 99 00 amended to include composite products destined for ship supplies

Annex II extensively changed:

- Now contain CN codes, all products must comply with Article 6 (1) (a) of Decision 2007/275
- Removed: empty gelatin capsules, meat extracts and meat concentrates – now subject to checks and import conditions stated before
- Some products listed in Annex II such as bread, cake, stuffed olives must contain less than 20% POAO. If they contain more than 20% POAO and with a CN code in 2007/275, then subject to checks, but composite rules will still apply.
- Chocolate, confectionary, pasta and noodles containing less than 50% dairy and egg and that complies with Article 6 (1)(a) (shelf stable, or have undergone cooking process etc.) not subject to checks

Changes 7

- Soup stocks and flavourings containing meat extracts, meat concentrates and animal fat now subject to checks and meat product or composite product import conditions apply
- Soup stocks must contain less than 50% fish oil, fish powders and fish extracts to be outside veterinary checks
- Food supplements containing glucosamine, chondroitin and chitosan packed for the final consumer now subject to vet checks if supplement contains pure POAO or is not a composite product containing less than 50% POAO
- Small amounts in food supplements in previous Annex replaced by less than 20% total POAO
- Please tell us of any products with a CN code not in 2007/275 that should be subject to checks.

Changes 8

- ISSUES STILL TO RESOLVE
- Import requirements for amino acids made from animal products for human consumption other than glutamic acid, glycine, cysteine and cystine
- Amino acids not for human consumption – which are not hydrolysed proteins
- Meat concentrates and extracts from 1 August 2017
- Import requirements for creatine
