## **AMENDMENT TO DECISION 2011/163/EU ON THE APPROVAL OF RESIDUE MONITORING PLANS**

This letter is addressed to Border Inspection Posts and Chief Port Health Officers in England only.

I am writing to advise that the Commission published Decision 2016/2092 today which further amends Annex I to Decision 2011/163/EU (as amended). The updating Decision can be found at the following link:

The changes are as follows:

1. United Arab Emirates added entry for aquaculture (with footnote)
2. Georgia added entry for honey
3. Gambia entry for aquaculture deleted
4. Kenya entry for milk deleted
5. Lebanon entry for honey deleted

To prevent any disruption to trade, until 1 February 2017 honey consignments from Lebanon shall be accepted, provided that it can be demonstrated that they were certified and dispatched prior to 15 December 2016.
