## **AMENDMENT TO DECISION 2011/163/EU ON THE APPROVAL OF RESIDUE MONITORING PLANS**

This letter is addressed to Border Inspection Posts and Chief Port Health Officers in England only.

I am writing to let you know that Commission Implementing Decision 2018/233, which further amends Annex 1 to Commission Decision 2011/163/EU has been issued. The Decision applies from 15<sup>th</sup> February and can be found here:

- Aquaculture and farmed game entry for Zimbabwe deleted
