OUTBREAK OF LUMPY SKIN DISEASE IN JAPAN

Purpose

- To inform you of restrictions on the import of the following bovine commodities from Japan in response to an outbreak of Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD):
 - Raw milk and raw milk products, including raw colostrum
 - Hides and skins, unless they have been treated in line with point 2b, c, or d of article 11.9.13 of the WOAH terrestrial code:
 - dry-salted or wet-salted for a period of at least 14 days prior to dispatch; or
 - treated for a period of at least seven days in salt (NaCl) with the addition of 2% sodium carbonate (Na2CO3); or
 - dried for a period of at least 42 days at a temperature of at least 20°C
 - All other animal by-products (except gelatine and collagen, tallow, and hooves and horns), unless they have undergone heat treatment to a minimum internal temperature of 65°C for at least 30 minutes.

Background

- Japan notified WOAH of its first case of LSD, which was confirmed on 6th November 2024 in cattle on a dairy farm in the Fukuoka Prefecture: (WAHIS).
 Further cases have since been reported. As a result of these outbreaks, Japan has lost its LSD-free status.
- On 13th November, OVS Note 2025/51 was issued to inform of the LSD outbreak and request that the following consignments from Japan be held:
 - Raw bovine milk and raw milk products, including raw colostrum.
 - Untreated hides and skins of bovine origin.
 - All other animal by-products of bovine origin (except gelatine and collagen, tallow, and hooves and horns), unless processed/treated to the required standards in the WOAH terrestrial code.

- Having assessed the situation and risks associated with the aforementioned commodities, it has been decided to suspend imports of the following bovine commodities from the whole territory of Japan:
 - Raw milk and raw milk products, including raw colostrum
 - Hides and skins, unless they have been treated in line with point 2b, c, or d of article 11.9.13 of the WOAH terrestrial code:
 - dry-salted or wet-salted for a period of at least 14 days prior to dispatch; or
 - treated for a period of at least seven days in salt (NaCl) with the addition of 2% sodium carbonate (Na2CO3); or
 - dried for a period of at least 42 days at a temperature of at least 20°C
 - All other animal by-products (except gelatine and collagen, tallow, and hooves and horns), unless they have undergone heat treatment to a minimum internal temperature of 65°C for at least 30 minutes.
- Dog chews made of hides and skins must also undergo one of the treatments specified for treated hides and skins. Dog chews made of bovine animal by products other than hides and skins must undergo a heat treatment prescribed for any other animal by-products. This is in line with the product requirements under point 'AH/P715 Product requirements' of the 'Dog chews (PET-D) GBHC563' certificate.
- The restrictions on raw milk, raw milk products and raw colostrum have been implemented on 3rd December 2024, through amendment to the 'milk and milk products' list, published here.
- The restrictions on hides and skins and other animal by-products of bovine origin are set out in safeguard declarations published on 3rd December 2024, coming into force the following day. The following safeguard declarations give effect to these prohibitions:
 - England
 - Scotland
 - Wales
- Imports from Japan of treated milk and milk products derived from bovine animals (Columns B and C in the 'milk and milk products' list) are unaffected, with imports continuing to be permitted.
- The UK Office for SPS Trade Assurance continues to monitor the situation and will issue an updated OVS note in light of any required changes to these restrictions.
