# OVS NOTE 2025/03

Changes to imports of display items and non-harmonised ABP from EU and EFTA member states, and update on import of research and diagnostic samples from Germany, following confirmation of FMD in Germany

## Purpose

- 1. To inform you of the revocation of **IMP/GEN/2024/08** and publication of **IMP/GEN/2025/01** for non-harmonised ABP from EU and EFTA member states.
- 2. To inform you of the revocation of **IMP/GEN/2024/06** and publication of **IMP/GEN/2025/02** for display items from EU and EFTA member states.
- 3. To provide an update about the import of research and diagnostic samples from EUU and EFTA member states.

#### Background

Display items and non-harmonised ABP/derived products from EU and EFTA member states

- From April 2024, general import authorisation (IMP/GEN/2024/08) has been available for use to import any type of non-harmonised ABP/derived products and general import authorisation (IMP/GEN/2024/06) has been available for use to import display items.
- Following confirmation of Foot and Mouth Disease in Germany, IMP/GEN/2024/08 is being revoked and replaced with a new general import authorisation (IMP/GEN/2025/01). IMP/GEN/2024/06 is being revoked and replaced with a new general import authorisation (IMP/GEN/2025/02). Both will be available here: General licences and authorisations to import live animals or animal products -GOV.UK
- 6. These new authorisations will need to be used immediately by traders once published on gov.uk.
- 7. These new general import authorisations cannot be used for non-harmonised ABP/derived products or display items originating from Germany that were obtained from any of the following animals:



- cow, bull, sheep, goat, deer, camel, llama, alpaca, guanaco, vicuna, any other ruminant, any swine (that is, a member of the suborder Suina of the order Artiodactyla), elephant or rodent (other than a pet rodent).
- 8. If an importer wishes to import these types of products, they must now apply to CIT using an IV58 application form. A specific import authorisation will be issued subject to a satisfactory assessment of the application.

### Research and diagnostic samples from Germany

- 9. Traders can continue to import research and diagnostic samples from Germany in accordance with the conditions found in <u>Import of research and diagnostic samples -</u> <u>Import Information Note (IIN) ABP/30 - GOV.UK</u>.
- 10. In line with current guidance, from 1 February 2025, all imports of research and diagnostic samples from EU and EFTA member states, including Germany, will be required to meet the import conditions in general import authorisation <u>IMP-GEN-2024-13</u>, which must accompany the consignment.
