# Updated guidance on exporting containers of unpackaged fresh fishery destined for immediate canning

Date issued: 06 April 2022

#### **Purpose**

1. To update OVs and FCCOs with guidance on exporting fresh fishery products destined for immediate canning.

### **Background**

2. Following recent technical discussions with the European Commission, Defra is providing updated guidance.

### Update on export of fresh fishery products

- 3. For exports to the EU, EU Regulation 853/2004 requires that containers of unpackaged fresh fishery products stored under ice must ensure that melt water does not remain in contact with the products.
- 4. However, DEFRA have received confirmation from French officials that exports of fresh gutted or headed sardines and mackerel destined for immediate canning may be transported in tanks containing a mix of water and ice.
- 5. These products must enter the EU via a French Border Control Post, and the intention for canning at the approved establishment in France must be identified on the Export Health Certificate.
- 6. This exemption to the Regulation 853/2004 requirement is only applicable to sardines and mackerels for this specific industry.
