**Notes for Official Veterinarian**

1. The original copy of this document must be left at the premises of loading with the original copy of the EHC.
2. A copy of this document, a copy of the Part I of the EHC and a completed copy of Part II of the EHC must be emailed on the same day on which the EHC is signed to Centre for International Trade Carlisle (CITC).
3. In the case of an export not proceeding, this form must be returned to CITC with the unused EHC.
4. If the consignment is cancelled, the exporter must advise CITC.
5. An animal could be deemed 'not eligible to travel' due to not fulfilling the health criteria stated on the EHC or due to not being fit to be transported.

**Notes for Exporter**

1. In the event that the export consignment is selected to undergo an APHA supervised loading, please provide this document to the APHA staff during the supervised loading inspection.
  2. If the export consignment is not selected to undergo an APHA supervised loading this document can be retained or destroyed at the exporter's discretion after the exported consignment has departed the premises of loading.
