Conditions of Issue

1. This licence may only be used to move cattle **on foot** between adjacent holdings (i.e. having a common boundary) in Wales without the need for Pre-Movement testing.
2. Cattle will move between holdings directly, or across (and in certain cases, short distances along) lanes and smaller roads up to and including those categorised as 'B' roads (i.e. non-trunk roads).
3. There will be no contact between the cattle being moved to/from the additional land and Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) susceptible livestock from any other herd or flock. Where the holder of the licence is the sole cattle grazier of common land, this condition is not applicable to nose to nose contact with other FMD susceptible species present on the common.
4. The route walked by the cattle will not pass over any land, including fields, where the applicant does not have sole control over all FMD susceptible livestock.
5. There will be no nose to nose contact with FMD susceptible livestock in adjacent herds and flocks once the licensed cattle arrive. Where the holder of the licence is the sole cattle grazier of common land, this condition is not applicable to nose to nose contact with other FMD susceptible species present on the common.
6. The licence applicant is the sole occupier of the main holding and of the area on the adjacent holding to be occupied by the licensed cattle, unless the area of adjacent land is common land, in which case the licence applicant must be the sole cattle grazier.
7. This licence is issued to the keeper of the cattle being moved and may be amended, suspended or revoked, in writing, at any time.
8. The person in charge of the cattle being moved shall, on demand by a Veterinary Inspector (VI), an Officer of the Welsh Government (WG) or by an Inspector of the Local Authority (LA) or by a member of a police force, furnish his/her name and address and shall produce a copy of this licence and allow it to be copied.
9. The main holding and the area of land on the adjacent holding marked on the attached map will be treated as a single farming unit for purposes of disease control.
10. This licence may not be used to move cattle from holdings subject to restriction for disease other than bovine tuberculosis.
11. This licence may be used for 'to and fro' moves between the two holdings detailed overleaf, provided such moves are between holdings linked on the Cattle Tracing System (CTS) and the moves are recorded (but not necessarily reported to British Cattle Movement Service (BCMS)).
12. The person in charge of the cattle will apply to Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) in writing in advance if he/she wish to make any changes to this arrangement, and will not implement those changes until authorisation is received from APHA. This includes applying for the licence to be revoked should the owner/occupier of the adjacent holding require use of the specified area of land or if the person in charge of the cattle is no longer the sole cattle grazier.
